The Feast of Lights is (apparently) a modern application of the ancient celebration of the Feast of Candlemas, or the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Feb.2). Trad-- itionally, Candlemas was celebrated by the People all bringing lighted candles to their churches on Candlemas - Eve. They then processed into the dark church bearing their candles, thus celebrating Mary and Joseph bringing Jesus to the temple 40 days after his birth to present him to God as the Law commanded. The People remained in the Church, bearing their candles while a service was celebrated. They then returned to their homes bearing the blessed candles.

Today, we celebrate the Feast of Lights as a liturgical, active reminder of all who have carried the Light and Word of Christ to the world through the centuries. In the Narrative, we will remember and honor the Apostles, Paul, the Bishops and other Clergy, and all who have bourne Christ's light. Then, we will remember that we. too, are bearers of His Light and act this out by carrying lighted candles out into the night. What we do is much more than lighting and bearing candles. We are reminding ourselves that it is we whom Christ left in the world to carry on his work, and to spread his light. It is customary to bear one's candle home where the flame may be transferred and allowed to burn for a time, reminding us that Christ is the light of the world, the light of our lives, and the light of our homes.

NOTE: If you have coats, it is suggested that you slip them on quietly during the reading of the Narrative. At - the end of the reading, the Junior Young Churchmen will come down into the Nave and light the candles of those in the front of the church. Turn and light the candles of those in back of you until the light is spread throughout the church. At the end of the service, the congreg-- ation is asked to follow the procession out of the church; bearing their candles. It is customary to go right to your cars and return directly to your homes bearing the lighted candles.
